## Doug wins English Golf Captains Tournament

HE revamped English Golf Captains Final took place at Ashford Manor Golf Club, close to Heathrow Airport, on the same weekend as Europe were securing an historic win on the other side of the Atlantic.

This year's final, open to members of the English Golf Union's Golf Captains Scheme, attracted over 270 entries with a score of -2 being required to gain one of the 81 places available at the final.

The final was played in blustery conditions and although the greens were in superb condition, few good scores were returned. Leading after day one was David Johnson (Lingdale) and John Evans (Brent Valley), both with 37 Stableford points, followed by Ed Winstone (Forest of Dean) and Graeme MacDonald, the Newark head greenkeeper, with 36.

Many locals were keeping an eye on David Soar, the Captain of Ashford Manor. Unfortunately, he failed to make use of his local knowledge and returned scores of 28 and 26 points to finish at the back of the field.

Day two brought early signs of a few sore heads from the

Ryder Cup thrills of the previous evening and a few uneasy opening tee shots. Gradually heads began to clear and a few finalists started to post good scores.

Best of those was Doug Briscoe from the Wrekin with 38 points to add to his

opening 31 to set the target on 69. As the day progressed the o ver n i g h t leaders failed to pass Briscoe's score and only

MacDonald, with 33 points to his opening 36, got near, losing on countback over the last 18 holes. Prizes were awarded to the

top 10 places plus the best score and runner-up of each of the rounds. Briscoe collected the new trophy, kindly donated by Philip Parker, Chairman of the English Golf Union. All finalists were guests of the

f English Golf Union and received free accommodation and food throughout the final.

#### <u>Annual General Meeting</u> <u>Pontefract Golf Club</u> <u>1<sup>st</sup> September 2005</u>

The minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Association held at Rotherham Golf Club on 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2004, together with the Secretary's Report and Financial Statement were circulated to members prior to the meeting.

#### Meeting started at 9.00pm.

Apologies: Stan Quinn, Barry Townsend, Roger Stansfield.

Matters Arising: None

#### Secretary's Report

<u>Membership</u>: A very steady year. I have received 22 enquiries for membership. There are about 20+ members who have not paid this year. Treasurer and Secretary meet each year and if a member has not paid for 2 consecutive years they are removed from lists. Our membership remains at about a figure of 187. Of this figure we have about 87 members attending events this year with a "hard core" of 15-20 members who play in 5 fixtures or more.

<u>Website:</u> Barry Ingham has done an excellent job regarding the History of the Association. Now he has all the detail it will be a lengthy, but worthwhile process of disseminating the facts from the fiction. Once this is in place we will have a comprehensive website. The majority of new member enquiries come from either the BLHGA or WALG website.

#### <u>Meetings:</u>

We have continued the theme of last year in regard to the number of events. The current number of fixtures appears about right and the numbers attending the majority of events is over the 30 mark. I am conscious we need to have a comprehensive geographical spread of fixtures and with us not visiting either Buckingham or Burghley Park there was a need to have a meeting in the south to attract our members in that area. We visited Dunstable Downs again and whilst we were looked after very well our numbers were disappointing. Our first trip to Longcliffe was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who attended but again numbers were low. Portpatrick continues to go from strength to strength with another excellent turn out.

Our Captain's Day at Robin Hood was an unqualified success with 40+ attending. The course was excellent as was the welcome in the clubhouse.

The President's Day at the Wrekin was very well attended and again everyone had a super day. Doug's course was in first class condition with the greens very difficult to read.

The Committee have given a commitment to keep costs to £50.00 per head and I am looking to keep at that figure next year. You will see from the accounts produced by our Treasurer that we make a "profit" at some events and "losses" at others. Provided they average out over the year and events do not consistently run at a loss there is no real need to review costings. At £50.00 it does represent excellent value. Every year

members advise its cheaper to play senior events - I do acknowledge that but often you do not play 27 holes and have lunch and an evening meal.

I am very hopeful we can return to some old favourites next year, yet introduce some new venues. I am pricing out Rotherham, Buckingham and Burghley Park and if costs are reasonable we will go there in 2006.

#### Club Championships:

The Championship at the Belfry was a new venture in as much as we held it over 2 days. It was better attended than many recent Championships. My special thanks go to Tony Broadhurst who spearheaded the organisation of the event. The Committee do need to assess what to do in 2006 and build upon the success at the Belfry. Our congratulations go to Jonathan Tune (National Champion and winner of the Bob Charles) and Peter Read, Secretary of WALG (winner of the Malcolmson).

#### World Championships – Ireland 2005

Full details will appear in the next Newsletter, but congratulations go to Malcolm Barker - Super Seniors Champion.

Congratulations also to Frank McCabe and Roger Stansfield who won their flights. Thanks to the Captain, Treasurer and members of the Committee for their hard work this year.

I have just finished trawling through all John Turner's files with a view to producing a history of our Association. It puts today's situation into perspective. It was always assumed that we were a wealthy organisation. We were not. Even in the 1970's when Roger Wood was our Secretary it was necessary to obtain a £300.00 bank overdraft to purchase ties. It was not unusual for members to be approached for short-term loans to cover financial problems. It may not be fully appreciated that we have not always enjoyed Committee Meetings, elections and an AGM at which finances can be examined.

In short we are more democratic, more accountable and more financially secure than at any time in our history.
