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
From the 2015 Captain: Chris Birch

#### 2013-2014 Treasurer's Report

It was agreed at last year's AGM that the profit from hosting the World Championships in Dundee would be earmarked and used to subsidise future events in the hope of attracting improved attendances in 2014. It had a worthy aim of returning money to those active in supporting our events. It is questionable if this achieved the purpose expected. You will note that every fixture lost money. This does not represent a major problem as you can see from our accounts that we are financially very stable. Ignoring the reduction in our reserves through subsidising events members will note that our assets only fell by just under £60.00. It is however worth pointing out that the average cost per person, per fixture is about £62/65. This is because we do not attract discounts as usually our party is below 35 players. Our Secretary when arranging fixtures does cost all expenditure prior to making the booking. If there were any chance of the Association making a large, unaffordable loss on any event the fixture would not take place. This "system" has been in operation for many years now and is working as the current financial position illustrates.

Our operating balance as at 31<sup>st</sup> July 2013 and 31<sup>st</sup> July this year, excluding the reserve is shown below:
